- familiarity with sampling methods and questionnaire design;
- · familiarity with secondary data analysis;
- · ability to implement and oversee large scale surveys;
- ability to work in multi-disciplinary and multi-national teams with senior and junior colleagues;
- ability to write and convey social scientific findings in a clear and cogent way, and a good record of publication.

Also highly desirable would be any of the following:

- · experience planning and managing research projects;
- familiarity with literature and techniques surrounding the measurement of social capital and social networks;
- · skills in innovative data visualization;
- skills in agent-based modeling.
