### **Session: Challenges of Mixed Methods Data Analysis and Interpretation**

One of the most important problems of mixed methods research is how to combine qualitative and quantitative data analysis in generating “meta-inferences” (Teddlie/Tashakkori 2009: 300). Some solutions for dealing with this „integration challenge“ (Freshwater/Fetters 2015; Bryman 2007) are broadly discussed in handbooks (Cresswell/Plano Clark 2011; Tashakkori/Teddlie 2010), but in practical research applications specific difficulties arise which are not covered by existing methods literature. In our session we want to provide a forum for discussing problems of a joined data analysis which were faced during specific research projects and the solutions found for them: What techniques and quality criteria are used? Are there differences regarding different mixed methods designs, data types, research methods? How do researchers deal with contradictory results? Papers should discuss methodological problems with regard to specific empirical projects.
