Short description of vacancy: The start date will be 1 October 2018 (or as agreed upon). The funding of the doctorate is limited to a period of four years. The successful applicant is expected to contribute to a project combining legal and political science perspectives on ‘Migration Governance through Trade Mobilities’ under the supervision of Dr. Marion Panizzon (University of Bern) and Prof. Sandra Lavenex (University of Geneva). This position is for a candidate with a Master Degree in Political Science or equivalent wishing to pursue a PhD in Political Science.

The project investigates from a legal and political science perspective the inclusion of migration/mobility clauses in trade agreements with a focus on European and Asian free trade agreements and the implications of these clauses in national migration systems.

Requirements: You have completed a Master Degree in Political Science or equivalent. Excellent knowledge of qualitative and quantitative methods. Participation in an interdisciplinary doctoral program coordinated by the University of Neuchatel is expected. Regular attendance of events at the University of Neuchatel, or elsewhere in Switzerland, is required as well as interest in interdisciplinary collaborations with other nccr – on the move collaborators in the framework of different NCCR events.

Working language within the NCCR is English. Excellent knowledge of German and French are an asset.

Benefits: The salary is in accordance with the regulations of the Swiss National Science Foundation. The nccr – on the move offers attractive working conditions, including support measures for researchers with childcare duties.

Employer: The position is based at the Global Studies Institute of the University of Geneva.
